

Histogram for scaled questions



- I felt like this semester we did not get an adequate amount of feedback on our work. Unlike in an industry setting where the leads and producers would be giving weekly feedback, there were months of time where we never got feedback from Kevin. This was unfortunate, because sometimes it is best to get feedback from people outside of your project instead of the same group of people seeing it over and over again. This really was a hinderance to our ability to create a final product that felt to industry standard.

Instead we were always told to "talk with our groups" who had already seen our work many times throughout the week. So when we went to talk in groups there was nothing new that could be said. The timeline also wasn't great,

and I would have liked to have seen less time for blocking and more for the 2 passes of animation, or even splitting the 2 passes into 3 or 4 passes, just so we could get more feedback from Kevin.
